



- I'm one of the smallest and lightest birds in Britain I weigh about the same as a £1 coin!
- Despite my tiny size, I have a very LOUD song and I like to tell you off if you come too close
  - My scientific name, Troglodyte, means "cave dweller"
- We nest communally in the winter the most ever recorded was 61 in one nest box (in 1969, in Norfolk!)
- Mainly spiders and insects
- Partial to a tadpole in spring
- What I eat
- You can feed me mealworms, oatmeal or cheese on the ground in winter
