## About me

- I'm one of the smallest and lightest birds in Britain – I weigh about the same as a £1 coin!
- Despite my tiny size, I have a very LOUD song and I like to tell you off if you come too close
- My scientific name, Troglodyte, means “cave dweller”
- We nest communally in the winter – the most ever recorded was 61 in one nest box (in 1969, in Norfolk!)



## What I eat

- Mainly spiders and insects
- Partial to a tadpole in spring
- You can feed me mealworms, oatmeal or cheese on the ground in winter



## My feather colours

- Beautifully brown, cream/buff and white
- Speckly with pale flash across my eye
- Males and females the same



## Where I live

- Woodland farmland, heathland, parks and gardens
- Across the whole country



## My nest

- Delicate dome made from moss, plants, lichen, leaves and feathers
- Found in hollows or crevices
